2	 A Divided Society ▶ Racism became set firmly in the South ▶ Individuals took step to ensure that Afr. Amer. were kept separate from whites and did not enjoy their new found rights
3	 Voting Restrictions ▶15th Amendment prohibited any state from denying and individual the right to vote based on race (women excluded) ▶Southern leaders found ways to get around the 15th Amendment ▶Poll tax – Fee paid in order to vote ▶Literacy test – had to read a part of state constitution and explain it in order to vote ▶Grandfather clauses – if they did not pass literacy test, if their grandfather voted they had the right as well
4	Jim Crow Laws Segregation (separation of the races) became common in the South Southern states passed Jim Crow laws Required Afr. Amer. and whites to be separate in public places 1896 − Plessy v. Ferguson Supreme Ct. ruled that segregation was legal as long as facilities were equal for both African Americans and whites Problem was that things were not equal More money spent on white facilities than African American facilities

	 ▶ Lynching ▶ Violence against African Americans rose ▶ Many were lynched (hanged by angry mobs) ▶ They were lynched if suspected of crimes or behaving different than whites believed they should
7	Reconstruction's Impact ➤ Success and failure ➤ South rebuilt but remained agricultural and poor ➤ African Americans gained more but great limits were put on their freedoms
